
Fornebu closed in 1998.

Submit aviation strategy without plans for a local airport for Oslo

Transport Minister Jon-Ivar Nygård (Ap) presented a new national aviation strategy on 27 January which "aims to contribute to a sustainable Norwegian aviation". He says that investing in Kjeller as a local airport for the Oslo area "will require large investments" and is awaiting plans in Lillestrøm municipality and proposals from Riksantikvaren.



Investments in green aviation

The government aims for Norway to take "a leading role in aviation's transition to a sustainable future" and looks for a new local airport for the Oslo area. SAS has signed a 'Letter of Support' with the intention of adding the hybrid-electric ES-30 from Heart Aerospace to SAS' regional fleet. A new green local airport for the Oslo area will strengthen professional environments in research, innovation, education and technology development.



New aviation strategy will strengthen existing airports

The new aviation strategy "Meld. St. 10 Sustainable and safe aviation" promotes the strengthening and further development of existing infrastructure within aviation. The Research Council is now inviting players to apply for support to establish a research center for climate-neutral/sustainable regional aviation.



Increased cooperation in industry and energy

Norway and Germany enter into new agreements to strengthen cooperation on green industry, batteries, raw materials, aerospace industry, energy security, hydrogen and CCS (carbon capture and storage). Increased industrial and energy cooperation between the countries can speed up the green shift in aviation as well.





Future emergency base for a better total defence?

Since the first flights in 1912, Kjeller has been central to the development of the Air Force. With war in Europe, there is a tense security situation affecting the world. Now the Armed Forces are signaling that they will continue to be at Kjeller airport until 2028, or longer, depending on the security situation in Europe.

■■ Västerås is one of three airports that the government proposes to become new emergency airports and form part of the country's overall defense starting in 2023. "Today's security policy situation in Sweden's immediate area emphasizes the need for emergency airports, based among other things on the needs of the overall defense, for example with ambulance flights, firefighting, rescue services and more", according to the Swedish Government.

"This does not only apply to the Viking Age Museum. We have previously talked about the Nationaltheateret. The Norwegian authorities are simply not good at safeguarding our own cultural heritage. It is much easier to pour billions into new large-scale construction projects. When it comes to the slightly less glamorous task of making sure that things that are important in our history don't weather away, there is noticeably less ability to come up with the money needed. [...] I think that one lacks a little understanding of the dimension of what task this is. I think that all countries have a responsibility to safeguard artifacts from their own ancient history. The Italians must take care of their history from the Roman Empire. The Greeks have to deal with the objects that come up from the ground from ancient Greece. When it comes to these fragile items from the Viking Age, only we can do that job. We don't just do it on behalf of ourselves. We actually do that on behalf of the world's population".
